Bumblebees Are Nowhere to be Seen

Now that we are in the depth of winter huddling up to keep warm, spare a thought for our beloved bumblebee queens. At the end of autumn, the impregnated queens dug a small nest for themselves in the ground to hibernate over the winter. Some of their amazing characteristics include living underground at temperatures as low as -19 degrees. To stop them freezing up, their bodies contain a chemical a bit like the antifreeze we use in our car radiators. Amazing stuff, and in fact, this is how our 4 species of bumblebees originally

And finally, spare a thought for the two species of bumblebees that live in the arctic circle. These two are especially adapted for deep cold, and upon emergence in the spring can raise their own body temperatures up to 38 degrees in order to fly.


